





### Fall 2018 & Spring 2019 Online Learning Data


NTU continues to be a member of the National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA). The membership allows NTU to deliver fully online courses anywhere without having to get state-by-state approval to deliver our online courses. NTU was also named the 4<sup>th</sup> best online college in New Mexico, 2018 (https://www.bestvalueschools.org/best-online-colleges-in-new-mexico/). NTU earned a spot on this list due to its exceptional focus on online quality, academic excellence and devotion to non-traditional learning.

31 FULL ONLINE COURSES WITH 19 ONLINE FACULTY FOR THE FALL 2018 SEMESTER. THE ENROLLMENT FIGURES RANGE FROM 2 TO 22 STUDENTS IN THE COURSES. GRAPH BELOW SHOWS THE NUMBER OF ENROLLMENT AND THE COURSES OFFERED WITH TOTAL NUMBER BEING 278 STUDENTS.












THE TABLES SHOW THE FINAL GRADES RANGING FROM A, B, C, D, F, I AND NG (NG=No GRADE). IN COMPARING THE TWO SEMESTERS. 2018 IS A 67.99% **PASS RATE WITH FALL 2017** A 65.31% PASS RATE. OUR PASS **RATE IS INCREASING BUT OUR ONLINE COURSE OFFERINGS** ARE DECREASING.








THE DUPLICATED RECORDS ARE STUDENTS THAT ENROLLED IN MORE THAN ONE ONLINE COURSE. 27 STUDENT ARE YOUNGER THAN 18 YEARS OLD. AND 18-24 YEARS OLD ARE THE STUDENTS TAKING MORE ONLINE COURSES. MAJORITY ARE NAVAJO STUDENTS AND ARE FROM NEW MEXICO AND ARIZONA.























SP'18 A TOTAL OF 361 ONLINE STUDENTS ENROLLED AND 35 ONLINE COURSES WITH 22 ONLINE FACULTY. INCREASE OF 135 STUDENTS AND INCREASE 14 ONLINE COURSE OFFERING PLUS ADDITIONAL 9 ONLINE FACULTY TEACHING FROM SPRING'18 TO '17. PLANNING TO ENCOURAGE THE USE OF AN ONLINE TUTORING TOOL.












CHART: TOTAL NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE ACCORDING TO GENDER FOR ONLINE COURSES. THE TOTAL













THE TOTAL NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE ACCORDING TO GENDER FOR ONLINE





USING THE FACULTY AND STUDENT E-LEARNING POLICIES AS A REFERENCE AND ENSURING THE E-LEARNING DEPARTMENT COMPLETES ITS EFFORTS TO PROVIDE AND DEVELOP ONLINE INTERACTIVE SUPPORT SERVICES FOR BOTH FACULTY AND STUDENTS COULD SERVE AS A MEANS TO INCREASE THE SUCCESS OF ONLINE LEARNING.










WHICHE ICE — COLLABORATE AND PROVIDE AN INTERNAL PROCESS ON HOW TO ACCESS COURSE-SHARING RESOURCES TO HELP STUDENTS GRADUATE ON TIME. DESIGN A COMMUNICATION PROCESS AND DESIGN A FLOWCHART FOR OUR INTERNAL REGISTRATION PROCESS FOR ONLINE DUAL CREDIT COURSES.
