
Spring 2018 & Fall 2017 E-Learning Data

NTU retained membership to the National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA). This membership allows NTU to deliver fully online courses anywhere without having to get state-by-state approval to deliver our online courses. NTU was also named the 4th best online college in New Mexico, 2018 (https://www.bestvalueschools.org/best-online-colleges-in-new-mexico/). NTU earned a spot on this list due to its exceptional quality, academic excellence and devotion to non-traditional learning. **35** FULL ONLINE COURSES WITH **22** ONLINE FACULTY FOR THE SPRING **2018** SEMESTER. THE ENROLLMENT FIGURES RANGE FROM 1 TO 26 STUDENTS IN THE COURSES. GRAPH BELOW SHOWS THE NUMBER OF ENROLLMENT AND THE COURSES OFFERED WITH TOTAL NUMBER BEING **361** STUDENTS.








THE TABLES BELOW SHOW THE FINAL GRADES RANGING FROM A, B, C, D, F, I AND NG (NG=NO GRADE).




















TOTAL NUMBER OF MINORITY STUDENTS IN ONLINE COURSES FOR SPRING 2018.















IN COMPARING AND CONTRASTING BETWEEN FALL 2017 AND FALL 2016, THE ONLINE COURSE GRADES ARE GETTING BETTER. THE WITHDRAWS ARE INCREASING. 

USE DATA AND SURVEY RESULTS TO ASSESS AND IMPLEMENT IMPROVEMENTS IN ONLINE COURSES AT NTU. WORKING ON HOW ONLINE LEARNING CAN HELP INCREASE ENROLLMENT NUMBERS. WORKING ON BUDGET FOR ONLINE LEARNING. WHICHE ICE – COLLABORATE AND PROVIDE AN INTERNAL PROCESS ON HOW TO ACCESS COURSE-SHARING RESOURCES TO HELP STUDENTS GRADUATE ON TIME. DESIGN A COMMUNICATION PROCESS AND DESIGN A FLOWCHART FOR OUR INTERNAL REGISTRATION PROCESS FOR ONLINE DUAL CREDIT COURSES.
